School re-opens on Tuesday 23rd April at 8.55.

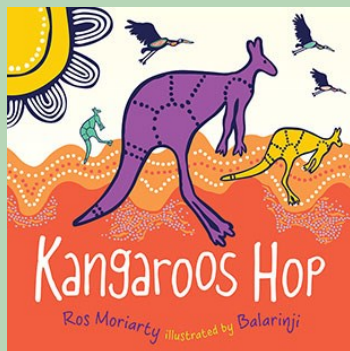
