Half term is the week beginning 29th May so we will be closed then. We are also going to be closed on June 8th as we will be a polling station for the general election.

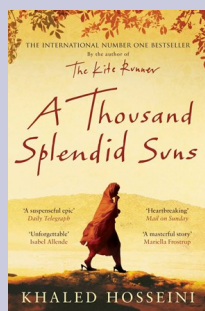
