During the holiday Tower Hamlets Food Bank collected all our food. It weighed 249.1 kg and will provide 498 meals for 50 families. Amazing!

PARENT GOVERNOR ELECTION

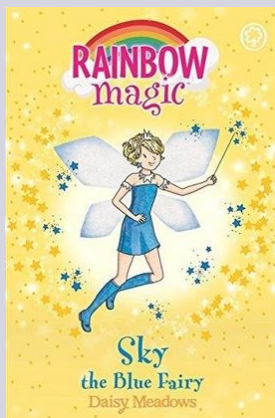
