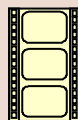

THE BIG DRAW FAMILY EVENT

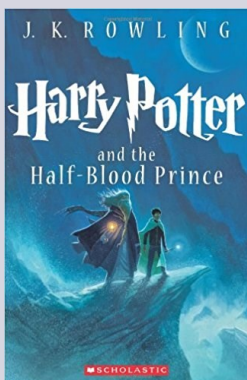
Next Tuesday at 2 pm we are holding a family event for Phase 2 classes as part of our Big Draw day. Everyone welcome in the Ground Floor hall!

Thank you to our wonderful Attendance Team; Miriam, Rujina, Ropna and Janice. Really valuable information was shared about the importance of good attendance and punctuality, along with great ideas for getting the morning off to a good start. It was also very interesting to learn about how much sleep children need. Did you know that children in **EYFS** need between **10-13 hours** per night, and **primary** aged children need between **9-11 hours** per night. The team also offered the following advice about the use of electronics before bedtime:

*Tablets, smartphones, TVs and other electronic gadgets can affect how easily children get to sleep. *Older children may also stay up late or even wake in the middle of the night to use social media. *Try to keep your child's bedroom a screen-free zone.
