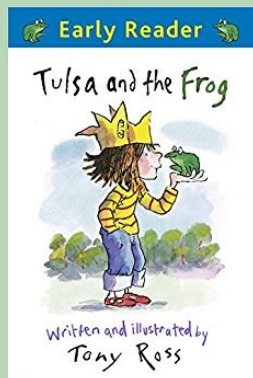
The new term begins on Wednesday 3rd January 2018.
