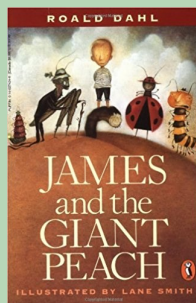
HALF TERM

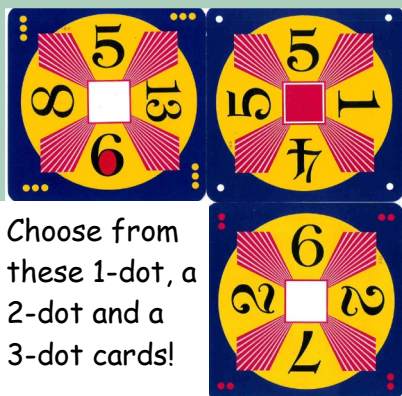
