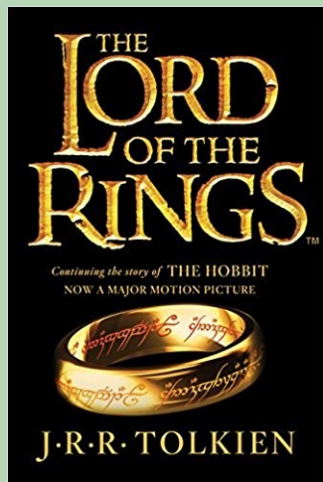
PSA CINEMA TRIP—SATURDAY 24TH MARCH

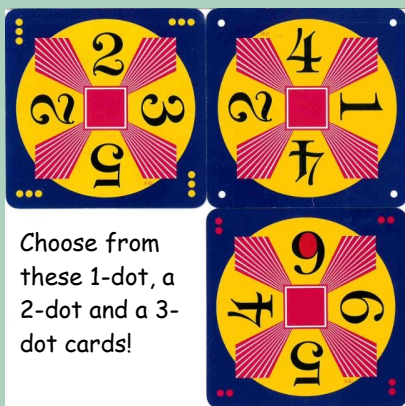
